The Blanchard Emergency Communications Center is 24-7 and will contact the on-call personnel regarding the incident. Each bidder shall accompany his original bid, with a certified or Cashier's Check on a solvent bank located in Oklahoma or a Bidder's Bond, in the amount of five (5) percent of the amount bid, as a guarantee of his ability to perform the contract bid upon, and that he will enter into a written contract with the Owner to perform said work and/or furnish said materials in accordance with said plans and specifications and furnish the required bonds within seven (7) days after the acceptance of his bid.

Shop Local

Here's what happens when you "shop local."

1. For every \$100 you spend at locally owned businesses, \$68 stays in Blanchard. What happens when you spend that same \$100 at a national chain? Only \$43 stays in the community.

Code Enforcement

Help beautify Blanchard! It is a violation of the Municipal Code of any of the following:

* Allow the accumulation of trash and/or debris and our junk on your property.

* Allow tall weeds or grass (including edges along the street and sidewalk) to exceed 12-inches or higher.

* Accumulation of inoperable and/or junk vehicles and parts on your property.

* Parking of trailers, boats, and RVs in alleyways or in front of the building line.

* Allowing tree limbs over hang the street with less than 8-foot clearance.

* Failure to trim trees, grass and weeds in alleys or between sidewalk and pavement.

* Leaving grass in the street after mowing.

* Watering lawn every day or out of odd/even sequence.

The holiday season is upon us, with lots of delicious holiday meals filled with fats, oils and grease, known as FOG. The City reminds residents to "prevent clogs" do NOT toss these fats, oils and grease down the drain. If tossed down the sink, FOG

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can clog sewer lines and cause costly repairs not only to the homeowner, but to the City as well.

To prevent clogs, pour your liquid fats, oil and grease such as turkey grease, gravy, cooking oil or melted butter into a lid container, place it in the freezer until it becomes solid. You can safely toss the container in the trash.

There are more than 500 individual bricks still available for purchase and to be show-cased at this incredible Memorial. Individual bricks are \$125 apiece or 3 bricks for \$300. An Order Form can be found on the City's website at www.cityofblanchard.us.

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The City of Blanchard reminds citizens that the City receives 100% of our water from the City of Oklahoma City. As a result, we maintain a year-round, mandatory odd/even lawn watering schedule to facilitate the conservation of its ground water supply from OKC.

Addresses ending in an even number such as the 2^{nd} , 4^{th} , 6^{th} , 8^{th} , 10^{th} , 12^{th} , 14^{th} , 16^{th} , 18^{th} , 20^{th} , 22^{nd} , 24^{th} , 26^{th} , 28^{th} , and 30^{th} may water on even-numbered days of the month.

If your address ends in an odd number, then you can legally water on the 1^{st} , 3^{rd} , 5^{th} , 7^{th} , 9^{th} , 11^{th} , 13^{th} , 15^{th} , 17^{th} , 19^{th} , 21^{st} , 23^{rd} , 25^{th} , 27^{th} , 29^{th} , and 31^{st} of each month.

The City also encourages citizens to water before 10 a.m. and after 7 p.m. throughout the year.

PSO offers to its customers a 'Home Weatherization Assistance Program'.

Homeowners and renters with an annual household income of \$55,000 or less in a home less than 2,200 square feet and built prior to 2010 may be eligible for FREE home upgrades such as attic insulation, air and duct sealing, and more.

PSO's service provider, Titan ES, will perform an energy assessment at your home. If your home qualifies, Titan will schedule and complete the necessary home upgrades.

The services are completed at NO cost to you. PSO pays Titan ES for any approved upgrades completed on you home.

The winter solstice is one of the two times each year that the Sun is at its farthest point from the equator and appears to stand still. It occurs on Saturday, December 21st at 3:20 a.m. CST. The word solstice is derived from the Latin sol, or "Sun," and stitium, or "stoppage." The Halcyon Days also occur around this time. According to ancient legend, a grieving wife named Alcyone, or Halcyon, threw herself into the sea upon discovering the drowned body of her beloved husband, Ceyx. The gods took pity on the pair, transforming them into kingfishers with the power to still the stormy seas for 14 days around the time of the winter solstice while they built their nest and hatched their young.
